HABITS AND HABITATS :-

It is a evergreen shrubs which occurs at any time of the year, at any place.

PLANTS DESCRIPTION :-

The plant is a common shrub that can be found as weeds, the stem is stout and erect with less branching. The leaves are simple, somewhat blackish green in colour producing black liquid when squeeze. It is about 1 to 2 m in height.

PARTS USED :-

The leaves.

MEDICINAL PROPERTIES AND USES :-

Used for burns , cuts, injuries. It is also used for blood dysentery, diarrhea, and stomach pain.

CHEMICAL COMPOSITION:-

PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGY :-

Cultivated in moist soil in sun or partial shade. Cut stems almost to ground level in autumn after flowering Eupatorium purpureum prefers alkaline soil. Some species are subject to statutory controls as weeds in part of Australia. Propagation by seed sown in spring, by division of spring. Plants are cut when in bud, and dried for use in infusions, liquid extracts, and tinctures. Rhizomes and roots are lifted in autumn, and dried for used for decoction or tinctures.
