#### **HABITS AND HABITATS :-**

Throughout the temperate Himalaya between alt. 3 and 7,000 ft, from Bhutan , to Simla, Dalhousie, and Chamba, Khasia mountains, alt. 5- 5,000 ft, Yunan, Japan , Formosa.

#### **PLANTS DESCRIPTION :-**

It is a glabrous shrub with brownish bark and numerous, stiffly patent branches. Leaves are distichously, very shortly petiole, acute. Cymes few flowered, terminal. Petals are yellow.

#### **PARTS USED :-**

Seeds.

#### **MEDICINAL PROPERTIES AND USES :-**

The seeds are aromatic and stimulant.

#### **CHEMICAL COMPOSITION:-**

Not available

#### **PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGY :-**

Easily grown in any reasonably good well-drained but moisture retentive soil. Succeeds in sun or semi-shade but flowers better in a sunny position. This species is only hardy to about -5°C but plants can re-sprout from the base if they are cut back by cold. Plants in this genus are notably resistant to honey fungus.
