KVK, East Sikkim strengthens accreditation of horticultural nurseries through <u>NHB Schemes</u>

In an initiative to make aware of the farmers, National Horticultural Board, Gangtok organized a day long awareness programme on NHB schemes for recognition and accreditation of Horticulture nurseries along with demonstration of farm mechanization in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra, East Sikkim. More than 50 nos. of farmers from different villages of East Sikkim district were participated in the programme. The main purpose of the programme was to sensitise the nursery growers about the new and existing schemes of NHB for the Model Nursery Standards in terms of infrastructure, quality planting materials and adoption of Nursery Management Practices of Horticultural crops.

The programme was chaired by Shri P.T Bhutia, Director, Horticulture and Cash Crop Development Department, Govt. of Sikkim. In his opening remarks he emphasized on the present horticultural activities along with the existing state government schemes for the welfare of the farming community of the state. He stated that the national and international demands of organic horticultural produces are not being fulfilled due to lack of entrepreneurial ability of the farmers in the state. He also encouraged the farmers to adopt



the intensive farming system with the improved production technologies developed by the ICAR Sikkim Centre. The commercial cultivation of high value horticulture crops under protected condition was also shared through his presentation.

Dr. R.K Avasthe, Joint Director, ICAR Research Complex for NEH Region, Sikkim Centre, Tadong encouraged the farmers to enhance their productivity, profitability and sustainability of agriculture through improved production technologies in coordination with extension functionaries of KVK East Sikkim. He also added that KVK East Sikkim is working with the mission as "Farmer-centric growth in agriculture and allied sectors through the application of appropriate technologies in specific agro-eco system perspective".
