Animal health camp and training on vaccination of vanaraja poultry-cum-

More than hundred farmers benefitted by the programmes in Ralep and Nandok villages of East Sikkim.

Animal health camp and vaccination of Vanaraja poultry-cum- chicks distribution programme at village Ralep, East Sikkim:

The programme was conducted at Village Ralep, East Sikkim on March 18, 2017 from 10.00AM to 1.00 PM. At the outset, Dr. Rafiqul Islam, Senior Scientist, ICAR-NOFRI Coordinator and the welcomed the program Scientists from NDRI ERS, Kalyani, Nadia, WB. Dr. Islam highlighted the importance of the deworming, feeding



balanced feed and mineral plus vitamin mixtures to the dairy animals for optimizing

and maximising productive and reproductive performance. Dr. Champak Bhakat detailed about the prevention and treatment of mastitis in dairy animals. He also elaborated the participants about their current visit to Sikkim in connection with the training-cum awareness programme as well as distribution of various inputs like cattle feed, feed supplements and essential medicines for dairy



animals. Demonstration and hands on training on vaccination of Vanaraja chicks was given to the farmers of Ralep by Dr. Rafiqul Islam. Later Vanaraja chicks were

distributed to the tribal farmers of Ralep. After that an interactive session was held between Scientist and dairy farmers of village Ralep, East Sikkim. The farmers were educated by the scientists of ICAR-NOFRI and ICAR-NDRI, ERS, Kalyani and elaborated about the importance of deworming and concentrate feed and supplementation of



mineral plus vitamins to the livestock and poultry. The farmers have actively participated during the interaction. The problem of long post-partum anoestrus period in the dairy cows at Ralep was highlighted by many farmers. The scientists of

both the organizations addressed their queries and the farmers advised to for deworming and periodic providing balanced concentrate feeds and mineral plus vitamins. Later, the cattle and goats presented by the farmers for treatment at the camp were attended by Dr. Champak Bhakat, Dr. Anupam Chetterjee, Dr. Rafiqul Islam and Dr. P.K.



Pathak. At the end inputs like cattle feed, mineral plus vitamin mixtures and essential medicines were distributed to the farmers of Ralep, East Sikkim.
